## THE MEMO HEDRON

The Memo Hedron affirms Lois Macaulay's use of icons of art history to design contemporary furnishings.

By coating a particularly interesting hedron (Albrecht Durer "Melancholy" 1513) with a rich matt blackboard finish and adding a companion chalk container, this sublime ancient form is reinvented as an interactive sculpture. Replacing disposable notepads with reusable writing surfaces, the Memo Hedron is an art object with purpose.

How better to acknowledge the greatness of that important person than to add the might of ages and the beauty of art to their desk! The 8.5" by 11" size (\$195) and the smaller 6" by 8" size (\$95) come with chalk trough, chalk and a certificate outlining the origin. Hardwood, hand crafted in Toronto and exclusive to us.

The hedrons are part of the singular collection of lamps, chandeliers, pillows, drapes, and furniture available from **Lois Macaulay Design**, 98 Avenue Road, Toronto.

The **Memo Hedron**, her **spotlight holiday gift**, is a desktop accessory with a strong contemporary shape that references the power objects seen in 16th Century portraits. Alongside skulls and obelisks, the hedron, a building block of chemical matter, appears in paintings of great men of history - poets, philosophers, mathematicians and saints - in their studies (Luca Paccioli wrote "Divina Proportione" 1500 introducing perspective into art).
